Notes on the identification number

Purpose of the identification number

Each individual receives an 11-digit identification number for the purpose of unique identification in administrative proceedings, which is <u>permanently</u> assigned to them. No personal or official data is encrypted therein. It is, therefore, not necessary to assign a new identification number if personal data changes (e.g. residential address, marital status, gender).

Use of the identification number

The identification number is required in numerous administrative proceedings. It must, therefore, be stated in all applications, declarations and notifications regarding income tax to the tax authorities. In order to apply for child benefit, you will need your own identification number, as well as that of your child. Furthermore, third parties (e.g. credit institutions for exemption orders, employers for income tax deduction details) will require your identification number, in order to fulfil their statutory data transmission obligations. Please provide all third parties obligated to transfer data with your identification number on request.
